In Art the girls have observed and created their own flower painting inspired by the work of the famous artist Georgia O'Keeffe. The girls had fun mixing colours using either warm or cold colours on their petals.

Prep 4 rounded off their World War Two topic with a very special day. We had the Active Learning Company visit our class to deliver a fun and educational workshop about life during World War Two. The workshop involved dressing up, learning about weapons, designing medals, and playing with traditional toys. We learned how to march like real soldiers and had a competition to see who would have made the best drill sergeant. In Numeracy, we have been using grid references and compass points to give directions and find information on a map. We had great fun coding the Beebots to turn and move specific directions and rotate them 90 and 180 degrees clockwise and anticlockwise.

# Prep 5

We have had a busy start to our new term in Prep 5. As part of our whole school "Growing for Sustainability" project, we have planted spring onion seeds in our special class planter, and we look forward to a good crop in the next couple of months. We have been delighted to work alongside our Indian partner school, Garden High School, Kolkata in a collaborative project highlighting the surrounding Climate Change. Our girls worked in small groups to create eye catching posters which focused on how we can work towards taking greater care of our environment. The pupils of Garden High School have also created their own similar artwork, and everyone was delighted to observe how "great minds think alike!" at home and further afield, in many of the designs! We were interested to hear how high temperatures have resulted in our peers from India having to revert to online learning from home. We do not have the same problem with a lack of rainfall in Northern Ireland! We look forward to learning more and developing our cultural awareness about how climate change has affected our partner school.
