




Goodbye & Good Luck

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Prep 3





Prep 3 began the New Year thinking about waste. We had a visit from Anna Green from 'Eco Schools NI' who helped us think about what we put in our general waste bins. The girls helped Anna sort through some rubbish, and we found out that a lot of the waste could have been recycled if put into correct bins.

Prep 3 have also had an exciting month as they have just started their swimming lessons in Olympia Leisure Centre. They have really enjoyed their first couple of lessons and Monday has now become their favourite day of the week - no Monday Blues in sight!

Prep 4

Prep 4 have started their World War Two topic and they have had great fun learning about why the war started, food rationing, and finding out if they had any family members who were in the war. Some girls were lucky enough to have some WW2 memorabilia in their house and photographs of family members who were alive during the War. This term in numeracy, we have been learning about graphs and different ways of displaying data and information. We created some Carroll diagrams and Venn diagrams to sort and display information about food rationing. Prep 4 were joined by Anna from Eco-Schools this term. We looked at recycling, why it is important for the environment and where our waste goes when we throw it out. We had a look through our classroom bins at our rubbish from snack time and discussed what bin it should go into. Thankfully we didn't find anything too disgusting!







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Prep 5







Through our World Around Us topic, we have been learning about how the Stone Age people lived in groups and travelled around as they followed and hunted the herds of wild boar. This nomadic lifestyle meant that their homes had to be transported with them. In our Art and Craft sessions, we have been creating Mesolithic style tents from a range of materials. The girls have thoroughly enjoyed discussing the pros and cons of this way of life as they have constructed their individual homes.

In our Big Write sessions this month, we have also taken on the roles of Stone Age children and written diary accounts of a typical day. We look forward to completing our topic by creating menus based on the food available in these early times.

Prep 6

Prep 6 started the new year in style with a rugby tournament at Instonians to help promote the sport for girls. The whole class took part and enjoyed the fresh air, exercise and the delicious hot dogs for lunch! Work on our Northern Ireland topic has started, with lessons about the six counties and the girls are enjoying their project work on a county of choice. Numeracy work has been on special types of number and the class have explored prime, square, cube and triangular numbers.





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

Prep 7





P7 have started 2024 imagining what life would have been like on board the 'unsinkable' Titanic. We have explored the journey the vessel made, starting from its construction in Belfast, leading up the fateful crash. In Literacy, the girls have taken on the role of either a first-, second- or third-class passenger and written a diary entry of their experience onboard the Titanic with various 'Editing Stations' to edit, improve and up-level their work. The girls did a fantastic job of getting into the genre as well as using appropriate language from Edwardian times. Bincedibles was a serious message presented to us in an entertaining way by Belfast City Council. We were encouraged to look after nature in the world around us by following a recycling mantra of 'sorting, rinsing, crushing and binning' all our rubbish. We even received gifts of pencils that were recycled from newspaper!
