Another busy month in Prep 4 with lots of exciting lessons! In World Around Us, we have been researching about World War II and we recreated some propaganda posters. Each class in Prep now has their own planter in our garden area where we will all grow some vegetables or flowers. Prep 4 enjoyed researching what vegetables would be suitable to grow in our country.
