Each class teacher keeps a weekly record of Golden Time for each pupil. Pupils who have remained on the sunshine will enjoy the full 30 minutes of Golden Time. For each day on a grey cloud, pupils will lose 2 minutes of Golden Time. For each day on a black cloud, pupils will lose 5 minutes of Golden Time.

Cloudy Time

Where pupils lose 'Golden Time' they are sent out of their class for 'Cloudy Time'. During 'Cloudy Time', pupils are asked to discuss why they have lost Golden Time, how they feel about it and how they plan to behave in future.

A Positive Ethos



In line with other positive behaviour management strategies throughout the school, Prep has a whole school behaviour policy in operation.

This leaflet is intended to outline in clear terms our whole school approach to encourage all pupils to demonstrate positive emotional behaviour, conduct behaviour and learning behaviour, whilst at school and in the wider community.

All pupils who display positive behaviour will enjoy 'Golden Time' each week. All pupils begin the week with their names on 'the sunshine'. Should pupils behave inappropriately their names are moved to a 'grey cloud' and then a 'black cloud'. This results in a loss of Golden Time at the end of the week.

To celebrate excellent behaviour, 'Golden Time' takes place every Friday. Children have the opportunity to participate in a variety of activities which include table top games, craft activities or sporting activities.



Sanctions

Where sanctions are necessary, they are consistently and fairly applied by all staff. In the event that a pupil does not behave in line with positive behaviour expectations, the following sanctions have been agreed:

 Verbal warning- this is given three times before moving to a grey cloud
Working away from group for 5 minutes, name placed on the 'grey cloud'
Working away from the group for 10 minutes and name placed on the 'black cloud'

All pupils begin each day on the sunshine. If a pupil's name is placed on a grey or black cloud, pupils have the opportunity to move back to the sunshine if they demonstrate excellent behaviour for the rest of the day.
